In our Rotary or Rotaract Clubs we like to get to know our new members, one method of doing that is tell the newest member that they need to prepare a talk (sometimes called a "Classification Talk") and share it at an upcoming meeting. Here's an alternative to that -- do an interview of the New member, an informal way to introduce the member or a group of new members to the club.

Hint #1: This can also be used to interview experienced members.

Hint #2: Share this with the member prior to the interview, so he or she can prepare.

Career/Profession/Vocation

- 1. What do you do in your career or profession title?
- 2. Please tell us about your current employment and how long you have been in that role.
- 3. Please tell us about any prior vocations.
- 4. What is the most unusual or humorous thing that has happened in your career?
- 5. Relative to your current or a former employment, what keeps you up at night?
- 6. How do you see your vocation relating to Rotary? (Or What skills or interests or both, do you bring to Rotary?)

Rotary

- 1. What interests you the most in or about Rotary?
- 2. What would you like to see our Rotary club do in the community?
- 3. How has being a Rotarian benefitted you (and your family) or how might it?
- 4. Why are you a Rotarian?

If your club re-interviews Rotarians who have been long time members – ask these questions and ones above:

- 1. If you could fine a fine master, for what would you fine him/her for?
- 2. What have been some of the highlights during your time in Rotary?
- 3. What are you the proudest about in/of this Rotary Club?
- 4. How long have you been a Rotarian?

Other

- 1. What are your hobbies or interests?
- 2. Please tell us about your family, including pets.
- 3. Is there anything else that you would like to tell us about yourself?
- 4. What questions do you have for your fellow Rotarians? And/or club leadership?
